

PARTICIPANT HANDBOOK

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Visas / Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)

Citizens of the following countries do not need to secure an entry Visa to attend training courses in the UK:

Austria	Belgium	Brazil	Bulgaria	Croatia	Republic of Cyprus	Czech Republic	Denmark

If you are a citizen of one of the countries listed above, you can cross the UK border using a valid passport which should be valid for the whole time you are in the UK.

ETA

If you are a national of **Bahrain, Kuwait, Malaysia, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia or the United Arab Emirates**, you no longer need a Visa and can instead purchase Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA).

You will need:

- the passport you will travel with - not a photocopy
- access to your emails
- a credit card, debit card, Apple Pay or Google Pay, as the cost of the ETA is £10.

You will need to upload or take photos of the:

- passport
- face of the person applying

You do not need to enter your travel details.

Visas

If you are an international participant travelling to the UK from a country that is not listed above and does not qualify for an ETA, we recommend you check whether you need to apply for a **Standard Visitor Visa**. You can do so by clicking the following link: <https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa>

Do not proceed with your visa application unless the course fee payment has been cleared, or your application will be rejected.

A Standard Visitor visa costs £115. The earliest you can apply is 3-months before you travel and we recommend that you apply **immediately** when you enter this timeframe, to allow ample time for it to be approved.

You must have a passport or travel document to enter the UK. It should be valid for the whole of your stay.

You must be able to demonstrate that:

- 1) you will leave the UK at the end of your visit
- 2) you are able to support yourself and your dependants during your trip (or have funding from someone else to support you)
- 3) you are able to pay for your return or onward journey (or have funding from someone else to pay for the journey)

As you're visiting the UK to study, you'll also likely need to prove:

- 4) you have been accepted onto a course provided by an [accredited UK institution](#)
- 5) the course is no more than 6 months long

To prove these points, you will potentially need to provide:

- Bank statements and salary payslips for the last 6 months, clearly depicting the monthly credit of your salary in the corresponding bank account.
- Your contract of employment clearly stating your position / role / job title in the organisation, how long you have been employed there, and your salary.
- If your bank statement depicts transactions far greater in value than your monthly salary, you might need to explain this.
- Your course acceptance letter and corresponding invoice from LBTC, including evidence of course fee payment.
- Evidence of your family and ties to your country such as a marriage certificate, birth certificates of your children, and real estate deeds depicting your ownership.

Once your documentation is ready, please proceed to the online UK visa application using the following link: <https://visas-immigration.service.gov.uk/product/uk-visit-visa>. Select **visit visa**, and follow the instructions to complete and submit your application online. Please be VERY CAREFUL at this stage and submit only accurate information.

Dress Code / Weather

Whilst attending your course at LBTC, the dress code is smart-casual.

The weather in England varies depending on the time of year, but one thing that you can count on is that there will be rain! It rains for an average of 9 days every month in London, even in the Summer.

- Winter (December, January, February):
 - Average daytime temperatures: 2°C to 7°C (36°F to 45°F)
 - Winter in England is generally cold, with temperatures occasionally dropping below freezing, especially at night. Snowfall is possible, but it is often limited and does not persist for long in most areas.
 - We recommend that you bring warm clothes and accessories for the cold weather, like gloves, a hat, a scarf and jumpers.
- Spring (March, April, May):
 - Average daytime temperatures: 8°C to 15°C (46°F to 59°F)
 - Spring tends to start off cool and gradually warms up towards the end of May. March can still feel quite chilly, while May often sees temperatures creeping into the mid-teens Celsius, which is warm for us here, believe it or not!
 - We recommend that you bring clothes for warmer weather but with layers in case it is still cold. It is hard to predict the weather at this time of year.
- Summer (June, July, August):
 - Average daytime temperatures: 15°C to 25°C (59°F to 77°F)
 - Summer temperatures in England are generally much warmer, occasionally reaching into the high 20s Celsius or even low 30s Celsius during heatwaves.
 - We recommend that you bring thin shirts / blouses and something to layer in case the evenings are chilly. Even in the summer, you are advised to bring a waterproof coat or an umbrella as it is still likely to rain.
- Autumn (September, October, November):
 - Average daytime temperatures: 8°C to 15°C (46°F to 59°F)
 - Autumn sees temperatures gradually cooling down from the warmth of summer. September can still feel relatively mild, but by November, temperatures have usually dropped, and there is often more rainfall.
 - We recommend that you bring warm clothes for this time of year, including jumpers and coats.

Safety Guidelines

London is generally a safe place, but as with any major city, it is important to be mindful of certain things when visiting.

1. **Stay Alert and Aware:** Keep an eye out for your surroundings, especially in busy areas.
2. **Keep Your Valuables Safe:** Secure your belongings and avoid flaunting expensive items like jewellery and watches. It's better to keep them tucked away to avoid any unwanted attention or simply keep them in your bag until you reach your destination.
3. **Take Care of Your Phone:** London is bustling, so be mindful of your phone's safety. Keep it in a secure pocket or bag, especially in crowded places.
4. **Watch Out for Pickpockets:** Stay vigilant in crowded areas and keep your belongings close. If someone seems overly friendly or distracting, be cautious.
5. **Use Trusted Transportation:** Stick to licensed taxis and well-known ride-sharing services for safe travels around the city.
6. **Stay in Well-Lit Areas:** When out at night, stick to busy streets and well-lit areas. It is always safer to be where there are more people around.
7. **Be Mindful of Traffic:** London streets can be busy, so remember to look both ways when crossing and avoid using your phone near roads.
8. **Respect Local Laws:** Familiarise yourself with local customs and laws to ensure a smooth and enjoyable trip.
9. **Stay Informed:** Keep updated on any local advisories or safety tips during your visit.
10. **Emergency Contacts:** Save important numbers like local emergency services and your embassy or consulate just in case. You can find emergency medical contacts in the medical section of this handbook.

Cultural Etiquette

Please be aware of your behaviour, ensuring that you are complying with our standards of politeness and overall cultural etiquette. A document has been sent to you titled "Client Obligations", highlighting relevant areas of our terms and conditions in relation to your expected behaviour. Additionally, the following is a list of general rules to follow whilst in London:

1. **Queuing:** In England, we take queuing (lining up) very seriously. Always join the end of the line and wait your turn patiently, whether it's for public transport, attractions, or even just ordering food. The only time when this rule is not necessarily followed is when using the London Underground; it is acceptable to gently push your way onto the train during busy periods, or you could be waiting at the station for a very long time!
2. **Politeness:** Courtesy goes a long way in London. Say "please" and "thank you" often, and use "excuse me" to navigate through crowds or get someone's attention.
3. **Respect Personal Space:** While London can be crowded, it is essential to respect people's personal space. Avoid standing too close to strangers in queues or on public transport.
4. **Tipping:** Tipping in London is customary but not obligatory. In restaurants, it is typical to leave a tip of around 10-15% if a service charge has not already been included in the bill. You can usually check the bottom of the bill to see if a service charge has already been included.

5. **Punctuality:** Being on time is appreciated in London. Whether it is for a meeting, reservation, or event, aim to arrive promptly.
6. **Public Behaviour:** Keep public behaviour modest and respectful. Avoid loud conversations, excessive public displays of affection, or disruptive behaviour in public spaces.
7. **Dress Code:** London is diverse and accepting of all different styles, but it is wise to dress modestly when visiting religious sites or formal establishments. Always check if there's a specific dress code before visiting certain places.
8. **Greetings:** A handshake is a common greeting in London, especially in formal settings. In more casual situations, a simple nod or smile is also acceptable.
9. **Cultural Sensitivity:** Be mindful of cultural diversity and sensitive topics in conversations. Avoid making assumptions or generalisations about people based on their ethnicity, religion, gender or background. We treat **everyone** equally in London!
10. **Smoking:** Smoking is prohibited in many public indoor spaces and areas like public transport, restaurants, and bars. Always look for designated smoking areas if you need to smoke.

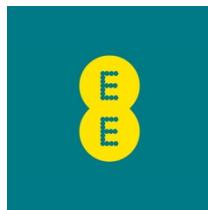

SIM Cards

If your current provider does not offer coverage in the UK, then local SIM cards can easily be purchased at the airport, directly from the service provider, or from the various kiosks you will encounter all over the city. The main network operators in the UK are:



Each London airport offers a selection of these main providers, along with either Lyca or Lebara Mobile. We recommend that you buy a SIM card immediately on arrival in the airport, so that you can use your phone as you would normally and utilise it for things like booking an Uber or paying for purchases.



In **Heathrow** airport we recommend heading to a **SimLocal** as they will help you decide which package is best for you and install the new SIM card for you.

Make sure to mention if there is a specific country that you would like to make calls to so that they recommend a package that includes the respective country.

In **all other London airports** there is not a SimLocal, so we recommend that you had to a **WHSmith store**, where you can purchase pre-paid SIM cards and staff will be able to recommend which plan is best for you.

If you are willing to wait and buy a SIM card outside of the airport, then it will almost certainly be cheaper, but of course, is not so convenient. There is a plethora of phone shops where you can purchase a SIM card from, including a few that are within a few minutes' walk of the LBTC venue.

Currency Exchange

To ensure your safety and convenience while visiting, we recommend carrying minimal cash and using credit or debit cards instead. Many businesses have shifted to cashless transactions, especially since the Covid-19 pandemic. Credit cards are a secure alternative, and mobile payment options like Apple Pay and Google Pay are also widely accepted.

Travelling in London

The following are the main modes of transport available to you in London:



• London Underground

Arguably the fastest, cheapest and easiest way to travel in London, the London Underground (also known by its nickname “The Tube”) is a rapid transit system serving the capital city. We recommend that you use this service as it is fast and very affordable, and it is the way that Londoners get around!

It is worth noting that there is generally no phone signal or wi-fi throughout the service as it is underground, so most people use the time to relax and listen to music or read a book.

You can use the following link to download the [TFL Go app](#) so that you can plan your journeys ahead of time and keep up to date with any potential delays on the Underground.

• Uber

Uber is our other recommended way to travel if you do not want to use the London Underground. Using the Uber app, you are picked up by your driver within minutes and normally for a much better price than with pre-booked taxis. You will need to download the Uber App and create an account if you do not already have one. Click here to download the [Uber App](#) on to your mobile device.

• Taxis

By far the most expensive mode of transport in the city – taxis can in fact lengthen a journey due to traffic congestion in London. Nevertheless, as they are readily available all over the city, taxis can prove to be a comfortable option, especially when the weather is treacherous or when you have luggage to transport. We recommend using **Express Airport Transport** if you are wanting to book a taxi as they provide a service across the city, not just to and from the airports. Their details can be found below:

Finally, if all else fails, you can hail one of London's iconic black cabs. Black cabs tend to be quite expensive, but they are easily accessible and good as a last resort.

• Buses

Always remember to double-check that any bus you board is headed in the right direction, or you might find yourself travelling even further away from your intended destination!



• Uber Boat

Uber Boats offer a scenic water taxi service along the River Thames. The boats stop at 24 piers along the Thames between Barking Riverside Pier in the East and Putney Pier in the West. Services run from early in the morning until late at night 7 days a week.

Like with the tube, you can touch in and touch out with contactless payment cards, as shown in the image to the left.

We especially recommend using this service in the warmer summer months, as there is an outside area on the boat where you can enjoy London's sights in the sun.

• National Rail

For those who opt to stay far away from the training venue located in Hammersmith, you might find yourself in a neighbourhood that is not on the Underground network. Instead, you are likely to find a National Rail station in the vicinity that will transport you to one of London's main stations from where you can join the Underground network.



We recommend that you use the [Trainline](#) website to book your train, as they compare trains from different companies and find you the best price. Make sure to check for any updates surrounding Rail Strikes before you book!

• Walking

London is primarily a walking city. Many of our famous landmarks are easily accessed by foot and some are **only** accessible this way. Whether you opt to travel on the tube or take a private car, it's unlikely that you'll be able to avoid walking whilst in London!

There are lovely paths to follow throughout London, whether it be meandering along the South Bank of the River Thames or wandering through the cobblestone streets of Notting Hill, every walk that you take can be enjoyable and will unlock a new layer of London's beauty.

• Lime Bikes

Finally, Lime Bikes are a popular option with locals in the summer months. These are electric bicycles which are dotted across the city, and can be accessed using the Lime app. Lime bikes are easy to use as they are motorised, meaning that you can explore London without breaking a sweat!
